### **ACTION/RECOMMENDATION**

I nominate Officer Andrew Steele to receive the Officer of the Month Award for his courageous efforts as noted below.

## **BACKGROUND**

On Tuesday, August 18, 2020, at approximately 3:02 a.m., Coral Gables Police units responded to 905 Alfonso Avenue in reference to a diagnosed female consumer having a medical episode in her bedroom. Ms. Kathryne Pfister had called 911 to report her daughter's mental breakdown. Upon the officers' arrival, Ms. Pfister advised that her daughter had locked herself in her bedroom with a knife and threatened to kill herself.

Officers Alexa Becker (ID # 10596), Christopher Hernandez (ID # 10771) and Geronimo Gibson (ID # 11014) approached the locked door and attempted to talk the individual into coming outside of her room. Involved other 1 locked the door and screamed that she had a knife and would kill herself and kill anybody else that tried opening the door.

According to Officer Christopher Hernandez, he had determined that a breach would be necessary to preserve the listed individual's life. Several attempts were made to kick the door while additional units responded with a breaching kit. After a few attempts to kick the door open, the individual opened the door holding a silver knife and screaming. Officer Hernandez deployed his Taser as one prong struck the individual in the upper right chest area, causing her to step back, and shut the door. A second Taser attempt was made by Officer Hernandez, but the door shut close before making contact. A small crowbar was used to open the door; however, it was unsuccessful.

At this time, Officer Andrew Steele (ID # 10591), arrived on scene, approached the door, and kicked it open. After the door was kicked open, Officer Steele noticed the female subject standing in the room with a knife in her right hand. Officer Steele was able to slap the subject's arm away and then proceeded to grab both of her arms and redirect her to the bed. The knife was

immediately pulled out of her hands by Officer Steele and she was taken into custody without further incident.

The listed individual was transported to Larkin Hospital by Coral Gables Fire Rescue # 2 (Lt. Tabon, Run # 20-004739) and released to hospital staff for treatment.

### SYNOPSIS/CONCLUSION

Based on the demonstrated courageous efforts, Officer Steele was able to disarm a combative subject that had in her possession a knife; while utilizing a minimum use of force. I am recommending that Officer Andrew Steele be recognized for his efforts via the Officer of the Month Award.

#### NARRATIVE

On Tuesday, August 18, 2020 at approximately 3:02 a.m., CGPD units responded to 905 Alfonso Avenue in reference to a baker act. Ms. Kathryne Pfister called 911 in reference to her daughter, Involved Other 1, having a mental breakdown. Upon arrival, Ms. Pfister advised Involved Other 1 locked herself in her bedroom with a knife and threatened to kill herself.

Officers A. Becker (10596), C. Hernandez (10771) and I approached the locked door and attempted to talk to the individual. Involved other 1 locked the door and screamed that she had a knife and would kill herself and kill anybody else that tried opening the door. Several attempts were made to kick the door while additional units responded with a breaching kit. After a few attempts to kick the door open, the individual opened the door holding a silver kitchen knife and screaming. Ofc. C. Hernandez deployed his taser and one prong struck her in the upper right chest area, causing her to step back and shut the door. A second Taser attempt was made by Ofc. Hernandez but the door shut before making contact.

A small crowbar was used but unsuccessful. At this time, Ofc. A. Steele (10951) approached the door and kicked it open (Refer to Ofc. Steele's supplement for details). The knife was taken from the individual's possession and was taken into custody without further incident. The individual was transported to Larkin Hospital by Coral Gables Fire Rescue #2 (Lt. Tabon, Run# 4739) and released to hospital staff for treatment.

Ofc. A. Becker took photographs of the scene and uploaded a total of 37 photographs to the UPD Digital Photos folder on the (Y:) Patrol drive. The Taser prongs were retrieved from the scene and impounded. The silver kitchen knife used by the individual was impounded into CGPD Property following the incident.

On 08/18/20, I responded to 905 Alfonso Av in reference to a female having a breakdown in her bedroom.

Upon arrival, Officer C. Hernandez, Officer Gibson and I attempted to make contact with the female; however, she barricaded herself inside her bedroom. After several attempts to verbally have the female exit the room, she opened the door brandishing a kitchen knife in her hand and moved toward officers. Officer C. Hernandez discharged his taser. Refer to incident report for further information.

Per my crime scene investigation, I observed taser prongs in the wall to the right of the doorway and on the floor, just outside of the doorway of the bedroom. I observed the knife that was in the female's hand on a table inside of the bedroom. I observed pry marks and damage to the door from the forced entry into the bedroom.

I observed a red mark from a taser prong on the female's upper right chest area. There were no other signs of visible injury. Coral Gables Fire Rescue responded and transported the female to Larkin Hospital.

No officers sustained any reported injuries on scene.

A total of 37 photographs were taken and uploaded into the UPD Digital Photos folder.

On 08/18/20 at 0302 hours I responded to 905 Alfonso Avenue in reference to a diagnosed consumer having a medical episode.

Upon arrival, contact was made with the mother who advised her daughter was having a medical episode in the bedroom and had barricaded herself in there and refused to come out. The mother further advised she did not have a weapon accessible. Officer Gibson, Officer Becker and I tactically placed ourselves on the exterior of the locked bedroom on the east side of the home. Several attempts at establishing a rapport with the patient produced negative results. The patient then proceeded to state she was actively cutting herself and was going to commit suicide. It was determined at this time that a breach would be necessary to preserve life. Officer Gibson positioned himself with lethal force on one side of the doorway and I attempted to breach the door while maintaining a less lethal (Taser) alternative. After numerous attempts to breach the door, the patient opened the door with an approximate 5" kitchen knife in her right hand. She proceeded forward into the doorway and I discharged my Taser as I stepped back. Contact was made in her right chest with one prong and I discharged my second cartridge as she closed the door, thus the second set of prongs lodged themselves in the door.

A unit with a breaching tool was requested at which point Officer Steele responded. Officer Steele was able to breach the door with his right foot and entry was made. Officer Steele observed the patient with the knife in her hand and ordered her to drop it. Officer Steele was able to slap the hand holding the knife away which caused the patient to turn. At this time the patient was taken down to the bed and Officer Gibson, Officer Becker, and I placed the patient into custody.

I initially pointed my sidearm at her telling her to drop the knife but she refused. I then holstered my sidearm and slapped the subject's arm away which resulted in her turning partway around and then I proceeded to grab both her arms with my hands and redirect her to the bed where I was able to pull the knife out of her hand without further issue.

Other CGPD officers then placed the subject into custody.
