

5. SHRINE BUILDING/BOULEVARD SHOPS, MIAMI, FL

RLA was hired to perform treatment on the historic cast stone sculptures, pilasters, and decorative relief panels, as well as 11 metal transom panels on the exterior of the Biscayne Shops building. 2. COCONUT GROVE PLAYHOUSE, MIAMI, FL

RLA completed a finishes analysis on the structure in 2016 in collaboration with Longevity Art Preservation, LLC for sampling and lab analysis for the project. For the report, approximately 100 samples were taken from the interior and exterior architectural surfaces of Coconut Grove Playhouse. These were taken in areas believed to be the most historically intact and important to understanding the building and its changes over time. The findings were analyzed, and a report dated June 27, 2016 was produced outlining the expected historic timeline for many of the decorative elements and walls in the building. This report functioned as a baseline for many of the investigative tests outlined in the following report. In 2019, RLA conducted an assessment of the Coconut Grove Playhouse that resulted in an investigative report and recommendations for treatment and removal of historic elements. The report detailed observations made during site



visits to the Playhouse, previous documentation and finishes analysis, and presented methodologies for removal and conservation.

3. HISTORIC HAMPTON HOUSE MOTEL, MIAMI, FL

This project included the recreation of the historic mural in the café of the Historic Hampton House. The original mural was largely destroyed in abatement efforts. Fragments were recovered by Historic Preservation Consultant (HPC) Steve Avdakov and were made available for examination for determining color palettes, paper types, and other important design criteria. Tests were made to determine the type of paints used. An initial line drawing was prepared to scale. Areas that were not visible in any photographs were extrapolated based off of the surrounding areas, as well as similar painted murals and wallpapers of the same time period. A color study based off of the initial line drawing and previously submitted palette was created to scale using Golden Acrylics as the paint system for the mural. To protect the mural, a protective matte varnish was applied. Golden Paints was contacted about the best application methods for protecting large-scale mural paintings. Based off of the company's recommendations, an isolation coat, a glossy MSA varnish coat with UVLS, and a matte MSA varnish coat with UVLS were all used to achieve the appropriate finish.

4. STETSON UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF LAW (ROLYAT HOTEL) - HISTORIC TILED FOUNTAINS, GULFPORT, FL

RLA has participated in two phases of work to date on the historic tiled fountains located on the Stetson University College of Law campus. The law school occupies the state designated Rolyat Hotel in Gulfport, FL and the four decorative tiled fountains are placed in and adjacent to the central courtyard. The first phase of work involved a thorough assessment of the four fountains and their finishes. 5. UCLA WILLIAM ANDREWS CLARK MEMORIAL LIBRARY, LOS ANGELES, CA

In 2016, UCLA's 1920 Clark Library historic building underwent a major renovation to comply with ADA upgrades. Selected for this work primarily because of our 2011-13 conservation work on the 1929 Wilshire Boulevard Temple's ferrous metal railings and exterior bronze lettering, RLA was tasked with conserving all bronze and metal windows, interior wood, and painted elements of the domed interior ceiling. In 2012-13 RLA carried out the assessment, stabilization, and full-scale repair, loss compensation and regrouting of a 13.7m x 3.6 m mosaic floor in the 1906 Beaux Arts Federal Building in Spokane, Washington. 


