
Where this started!

- Early 2018 Commission provided directive to inventory signs and make recommendations to reduce signage
- April 2018 Staff requested funding for Citywide Right-of-Way Asset Inventory
- July 2018 Funding approved for FY19 Budget
- October 2018 Funding available in FY19 Budget
- January 2019 Commission approves Special Procurement/Bid Waiver for CycloMedia to perform Citywide Right-of-Way Asset Inventory
- April 2019 January 2020 CycloMedia conducts and completes Citywide Right-of-Way Asset Inventory
 - March 2020 Kittelson & Associates were selected to analyze existing signage in three sections of the City


Existing Conditions

- 12,751 signs and 2,426 street name monuments
- Includes a combination of regulatory, warning, guidance, and miscellaneous (i.e. crime watch, no dumping, etc) signage
- Inventory is now in a GIS shape file for reference of attributes including location, type of sign, condition, and updates



Sign Evaluation


- Purpose: To analyze three sections of Coral Gables and evaluate which non-MUTCD and MUTCD signs could be removed, replaced, or relocated.
- Cost of Analysis: \$35,096
- Scope: Using Cyclomedia's Street Smart Program, consultant reviewed all signs within three zones to determine treatment for each one.
- Timeline: May September, 2020

Sign Evaluation Results



Three Analysis Zones:

- 752 signs (5.8% of total signs in city) and 242 street name monuments were evaluated
- 29% (i.e. 218 signs) of signs recommended for removal
- 22% (i.e. 168 signs) of signs recommended for change/relocation/replace
- 59% (i.e., 143 monuments) of street name monuments recommended to be modified, relocated, or replaced (including 18 monuments to be added)

Removal of Signs

• Parking + Non-MUTCD Recommended

Analysis Zone (100 *signs*): \$5,000

City – Wide: \$87,000

MUTCD Recommended

Analysis Zone (118 signs): \$5,900

City – Wide: \$102,000

Replacement of Sign Panels

Parking + Non-MUTCD Recommended

Analysis Zone (10 signs): \$3,000

City – *Wide*: \$52,000

Analysis Zone (14 signs): \$3,150


City – Wide: \$55,000

Analysis Zone (38 *signs*): \$8,550


City – Wide: \$148,000

What is the plan?



Public works is actively doing the following:

- 1. Beginning refurbishment, relocation and replacement of street name monuments throughout the city.
- 2. Continue removal of Non-MUTCD signage based on a phased review of Coral Gables (i.e. partitioning the city into sections to determine signs that can be immediately removed).



What is needed?

What Public Works needs from Commission:

- Funding for removal, replacement, and relocation of signage.
- Funding for the analysis of the remaining 94% of the city.
- Do we maintain the moratorium on No Parking and No Dumping signage?


