

Under 40 U.S.C. s. 3702, each contractor must be required to compute the wages of every mechanic and laborer on the basis of a standard work week of 40 hours. Work in excess of the standard work week is permissible provided that the worker is compensated at a rate of not less than one and a half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of 40 hours in the work week.

The requirements of 40 U.S.C. s. 3704 are applicable to construction work and provide that no laborer or mechanic must be required to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous. These requirements do not apply to the purchase of supplies or materials or articles ordinarily available on the open market, or contracts for transportation or transmission of intelligence.

More particularly, as set forth in 29 CFR s.5.5(b) which provides the required contract clauses:

- (1) Overtime requirements. No contractor or subcontractor contracting for any part of the contract work which may require or involve the employment of laborers or mechanics shall require or permit any such laborer or mechanic in any workweek in which he or she is employed on such work to work in excess of forty hours in such workweek unless such laborer or mechanic receives compensation at a rate not less than one and one-half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of forty hours in such workweek.
- (2) Violation; liability for unpaid wages; liquidated damages. In the event of any violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section the contractor and any subcontractor responsible therefor shall be liable for the unpaid wages. In addition, such contractor and subcontractor shall be liable to the United States (in the case of work done under contract for the District of Columbia or a territory, to such District or to such territory), for liquidated damages. Such liquidated damages shall be computed with respect to each individual laborer or mechanic, including watchmen and guards, employed in violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section, in the sum of \$25 for each calendar day on which such individual was required or permitted to work in excess of the standard workweek of forty hours without payment of the overtime wages required by the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section.
- (3) Withholding for unpaid wages and liquidated damages. The (write in the name of the Federal agency or the loan or grant recipient) shall upon its own action or upon written request of an authorized representative of the Department of Labor withhold or cause to be withheld, from any moneys payable on account of work performed by the contractor or subcontractor under any such contract or any other Federal contract with the same prime contractor, or any other federally-assisted contract subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, which is held by the same prime contractor, such sums as may be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such contractor or subcontractor for unpaid wages and liquidated damages as provided in the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(2) of this section.
- (4) Subcontracts. The contractor or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in paragraphs (1) through (4) of this section and also a clause requiring the subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts. The prime contractor shall be responsible for compliance by any subcontractor or lower tier subcontractor with the clauses set forth in paragraphs (1) through (4) of this section.

The City of Miami Morningside Park created an expanded and improved tennis facility at this 42-acre Park. The project included improvements to an existing seven (7) courts that had experienced degradation due to drainage and soil stabilization issues. A new court layout was developed to increase the facility to eight (8) lighted courts and a warm-up training wall amenity. Other tennis improvements included upgraded lighting, fencing ad shaded bench area. A central courtyard was also developed as a key element of the project design. 





Due to historic maritime activities in the project area, soil conditions were addressed through the design of unique drainage facilities that minimized potential groundwater impacts. The Baywalk design solution also improved visibility and lighting in the area to discourage vagrancy issues that existed. The planting design not only enhanced aesthetics, but also buffered unsightly adjacent parking and utility areas and minimized exposed

surfaces that had been subject to graffiti. Funding for this project was acquired through the Florida Inland Navigational District (FIND) Grants Program. The Grant Program financially cooperates with local governments to alleviate problems associated with the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway and associated waterways within the District. This project is being performed under our Miscellaneous Landscape Architectural Services contract.

IDENTIFICATION AND FORMULATION OF DESIGN OPPORTUNITIES

The Team will identify the potential design elements within current and future contexts. This is done through thorough analysis of the project site, and physical and visual linkages to adjacent the sites. Based upon these external factors and the vision as communicated by the City and key stakeholder input, the project will be analyzed to determine the most appropriate design that symbiotically complements existing uses and future recreational needs.

CONCEPTUAL DESIGN PHASE

Improvements anticipated for the project site will be shown accurately scaled to define the true spatial relations of the project. A preliminary opinion of probable cost (OPC) for proposed enhancements is prepared to allow the design Team and the City to identify appropriate budgets available. If the preliminary OPC exceeds the budget, design modifications or phasing are addressed at this stage. It is critical to commence permitting activities at this stage in view of the stipulated agency timeframes. Pre-application agency meetings conducted to identify key criteria and any agency concerns will help streamline the permitting process and minimize "agency surprises". Construction documents (CDs) will be prepared to include all plans, details, specifications and notes required for the installation or construction of the project elements. Elements can include infrastructure, planting, irrigation, architecture, hardscape,

paving, utility relocation, site structures, lighting, signage or other site amenities and will be submitted for applicable 60%, 90% and 100% reviews by the City. Meeting minutes will be prepared and distributed so all parties are aware of comments or issues to be addressed in future submittals. An updated OPC is prepared at each submittal stage. When CDs are at an appropriate percent of completion and City budget requirements are met, Miller Legg will begin the final permitting approval process through applicable permitting agencies.

BIDDING/CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION ASSISTANCE PHASE

Miller Legg will assist the City in preparing CDs into a biddable format. This would include the incorporation of the technical and design aspects of the project with the City's standard contract and general conditions. Miller Legg will assist the City in technical clarifications to bidders during the bid process and conduct a pre-bid meeting (preparing any required addenda) to ensure all bidders are equally informed and minimize the potential for bid protests and issues. With 56 years of experience, Miller Legg has led significant public involvement efforts, carried out required regulatory agency permitting, coordinated bidding activities and conducted construction administration efforts. Our design philosophy ensures the City's vision, in correlation with the desires of the stakeholders, the existing natural and built environments, as well as a project's sustainability and maintenance requirements.

DESIGN PROCESS

When addressing any landscape architecture project, Miller Legg evaluates the project using a select method of steps to achieve the highest quality deliverables for our clients. The Firm's typical project design process is outlined as:

- 1. Evaluation of Existing Conditions
- 2. Collaboration with Stakeholders
- 3. Design Stage
- 4. Preparation of Construction Documents
- 5. Implementation and Construction

Evaluation of Existing Conditions:

This step establishes the project's pre-existing constraints and improvement opportunities. Prior to design, we review existing infrastructure, community content, pedestrian / vehicular use, climate, adjacent improvements, linkages and project's relationship to the City's vision. These conditions

are noted and graphically prepared to identify relational and spatial opportunities for the project design. Existing onsite improvements are analyzed for condition and potential impact upon future enhancements. We also evaluate the project site so that any inconspicuous conditions are recorded before design efforts begin. Other considerations are: Code Requirements and Identification and Formulation of Improvement / Enhancement Opportunities: Analysis of recreational / open space viability, linkages to adjacent spaces or circulation routes and accessibility from a transportation perspective.

Collaboration with Stakeholders:

Throughout the project and design phases, Miller Legg will maintain continual communication with stakeholders, soliciting their input on the design and process. This helps to establish City, stakeholders, and other user desires for the project, and outlines the project program clearly for all parties involved. The City of Coral Gables community has very active stakeholders whose input and support will be key to the any project's success.

Design Stage:

In this third step, Miller Legg incorporates the analysis from the site evaluation, and combines that information with the stakeholder desires to develop the theme, composition and material selection. We provide design documents in 3 phases, Conceptual, Preliminary, and Final. The Conceptual Design is a quick graphic format, to visually communicate the overall design intent and potential project site opportunities. Miller Legg will review concepts with the



City to receive input on overall design intent. Our multidisciplinary collaborative approach includes the Landscape Architectural Team reviewing concepts with Environmental, Planning, and Transportation / Engineering members to ensure that the concepts are truly "feasible." This is necessary because concepts presented to The City and the project's stakeholders, need to be truly achievable project designs. Preliminary and Final Design Phase are developed upon City's acceptance of a project concept. Preliminary design documents are prepared, including the designation of general material types for various hardscape and landscape elements and infrastructure improvements.

Anticipated improvements will also be identified and presented, accurately scaled to demonstrate true spatial relations. A preliminary opinion of probable cost is generated to identify appropriate/available budgets for proposed enhancements. If the anticipated costs exceed the project budget, design modifications are addressed at this stage, rather than during the construction document phase.

Preparation of Construction Documents:

Construction documents, what the Contractor will use to construct the project, are prepared in accordance with the specifications outlines in the Final Design.

Implementation and Construction:

A key role for the designer, in this case, Miller Legg, is to provide contract administration and construction observation services to ensure the design is being implemented by the contractor in the way the City desires and Miller Legg intended. Miller Legg will conduct a review meeting with the City of Coral Gables and associated review agencies, prepare and distribute meeting minutes, so that appropriate parties are aware of issues to be addressed in future submittals. As construction documents continue to move through the development process, updated opinions of probable costs are also prepared at each submittal stage. When construction documents are at an appropriate percentage of completion, and comply with City budgets, the permitting process commences. Our in-house engineering and environmental services assist in strategically moving a project through permitting processes.

Contract Administration / Bidding Assistance Phase: The Miller Legg Team will assist the City in preparation and clarification of questions related to bid documents by incorporating technical and design documents with standard City contract documents and conditions. Technical addenda during the bidding process can also be facilitated and prepared by the Miller Legg Team. As needed, Miller Legg will assist the City during the bid opening to tabulate the submitted bids, evaluate the bids for the appropriate responsiveness and document the rankings of the bidders.


TECHNICAL

Utilization of the right software is crucial to communicate the project design intent to the audience. Miller Legg has full capabilities to develop all levels of computer aided design (CAD), including the current versions of AutoCAD, Microstation, Land FX and Impression. In addition, the Firm utilizes graphic software to generate the exhibits necessary to communicate a project's intent using ESRI (GIS) SketchUp, Adobe Creative Suite, and Lumion 3D Rendering Software. We have successfully utilized these resources to prepare community involvement, design and permitting documents for current and past projects at the City of Miami's Moore Park, Kennedy Park and Morningside Park projects, and the City of Coral Gables War Memorial Park project.

iller Legg commits to the continuous availability of resources required to design, permit and coordinate the projects in accordance with the terms of this Landscape Architecture Consulting Services contract and each project schedule. The members of our professional Team will be made available on an ongoing and as-needed basis to contribute to the required tasks and will devote the necessary time to complete the project on time and within budget.

SCHEDULE CONTROL

As Miller Legg's Project Manager, Michael Kroll, RLA, FASLA will conduct project kick-off sessions with Team members to discuss and review project objectives, client's expectations, scopes and deliverables, budgets, schedules, constraints and limitations, background and other available information and guidelines for internal coordination, documentation and quality control/assurance procedures. Depending upon the length and / or complexity of the project, status meetings will be held with the City's Project Manager to review project goals, milestones, and delivery dates. Our Project Managers use Plantrax and/or Microsoft Project applications to prepare a detailed schedule of each milestone completion. This schedule is developed with input from every member of the Consultant and Client Teams to ensure commitment to the schedule. For each project effort, this timetable is completed upon Notice to Proceed

and is transmitted to the Client Project Manager for review and acceptance. The process is tracked and updated as necessary. The Project Manager maintains and keeps all Team members on schedule. At our weekly department meetings, the priority projects for the week are discussed and staffing coordination is planned.

FAST TRACK / EXPEDITED BASIS

Constructability reviews and an understanding of the time needed for the construction to be completed allow us to guide the City in detailing these constraints in the contract documents. This ensures the schedule during construction is realistic and accomplishable without incurring acceleration costs or that these acceleration costs have been anticipated in the cost estimates where the need for expedited construction outweighs the higher costs associated.

Finally, contractor-initiated value engineering options are thoroughly reviewed and discussed with our clients. It is critical to ensure that the quality and functionality of the project is not sacrificed by these requested changes and that consequential changes such as permit modifications are factored into a value engineering proposal to fully assess the benefits and potential pitfalls if the proposal is accepted.



COST CONTROL



At the beginning of each project, our Project Manager, Michael Kroll, RLA, FASLA, and the City Project Manager will establish a schedule for regular status meetings. During these meetings the project production, contractual, schedule, scope, quality assurance and quality control elements will

be discussed. Mike will document these discussions and status of these meetings and submit the minutes for review by the City Project Manager within two business days of the meeting. These meetings will be in addition to any other scheduled production meetings.

Process Documentation

Each project task or activity has documentation and a template to ensure consistency among projects. All documents, including contract documents, letters, transmittals, etc., go through a quality control check before they leave Miller Legg. Meeting Minutes / Site Visit Memos are taken at each meeting or significant gathering / phone conversation. These documents contain vital project description information, date, who attended the meeting and topics discussed, a record of who raised a topic or question and action to be taken, if any. These minutes are then distributed to the attendees, Project Manager, City Project Manager and/or Prime/Stakeholders as applicable, and electronically filed for future reference. Plans/Document Review includes review of plans in regard to industry design standards and applicable local and state policies. Review of plans shall be led by an independent Registered professional. Quality Control review includes the applicable Review Checklist and documented in the project file along with supporting mark-ups and review comments. All reviews are conducted prior to a submittal being made to the client or applicable agencies.







SECTION V: AGREEMENT COMMENTS

e would request that the following revisions to the Indemnification clause be made to be compliant with F.S. 725.08.

4.5 Indemnification and Hold Harmless. To the fullest extent permitted by laws and regulations, the Professional shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City, its elected and appointed officials, attorneys, administrators, consultants, agents, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, and expenses direct, indirect, or consequential (including but not limited to fees and charges of attorneys and other Professionals and court and arbitration costs) arising out of or resulting from the performance of the work and caused in whole or in part by either (i) any willful, intentional, reckless, or negligent act or omission of Professional, any sub consultant, or any person or organization directly or indirectly employed by any of them to perform or furnish any of the work or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, regardless of whether or not it is caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder and regardless of the negligence of any such indemnified party, or (ii) any willful, intentional, reckless, or negligent act or omission of any individual or entity not a party to this agreement, or (iii) any negligent act or omission of the City or the City's officers, agents, or employees. The parties expressly agree that this provision shall be construed broadly, and Professional's obligations to pay for the City's legal defense hereunder shall arise and be fully enforceable when Professional (or any sub consultant or any person or organization directly or indirectly employed by Professional) is alleged to have acted willfully, intentionally, recklessly, or negligently in the performance of the work required under this Agreement. Any failure of Professional to comply with the terms of this provision shall be deemed a material breach of this Agreement and may subject Professional to debarment from consideration for future award of city contracts pursuant to Section 2-952(4) of the City of Coral Gables Code of Ordinances. This provision shall survive termination of the Agreement.
