Such liquidated damages shall be computed with respect to each individual laborer or mechanic, including watchmen and guards, employed in violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section, in the sum of \$25 for each calendar day on which such individual was required or permitted to work in excess of the standard workweek of forty hours without payment of the overtime wages required by the clause set forth in paragraph (b)(1) of this section.

Belle Isle Park, located on the only natural island of the Venetian Islands between Miami and Miami Beach, is a major open space surrounded on three sides by high-density condominium buildings, and Venetian Causeway to the north. The space offered no walkways or large open spaces for play, but was mostly used by residents to walk the dogs. SMDS was asked to create a plan to attract more residents to use the park, and responded with a plan which provided for a range of recreational opportunities. A large elliptical open space formed by a walkway, coupled with a "Bark Park" and numerous small paved seating areas – located by each of the park entry/street crosswalks – allows for both passive and active play activities. Numerous existing trees and palms were preserved or transplanted to create and define the park's spaces.

In addition to the park, SMDS was hired for the Venetian Islands GOB project: a mid-Miami Beach neighborhood general obligation bond project for streetscape, water main and drainage improvements, which included Belle Isle's streetscape. SMDS' role was to master plan and prepare street designs for the revised street layout/reconfiguration and signage. The master plan's major thrust was to call for narrowing streets to facilitate three goals: 1) traffic calming; 2) improve drainage; and 3) increase green space. A number of meetings resulted in creating consensus to target various improvements, i.e. planting, lighting, and sidewalk installation/repair.

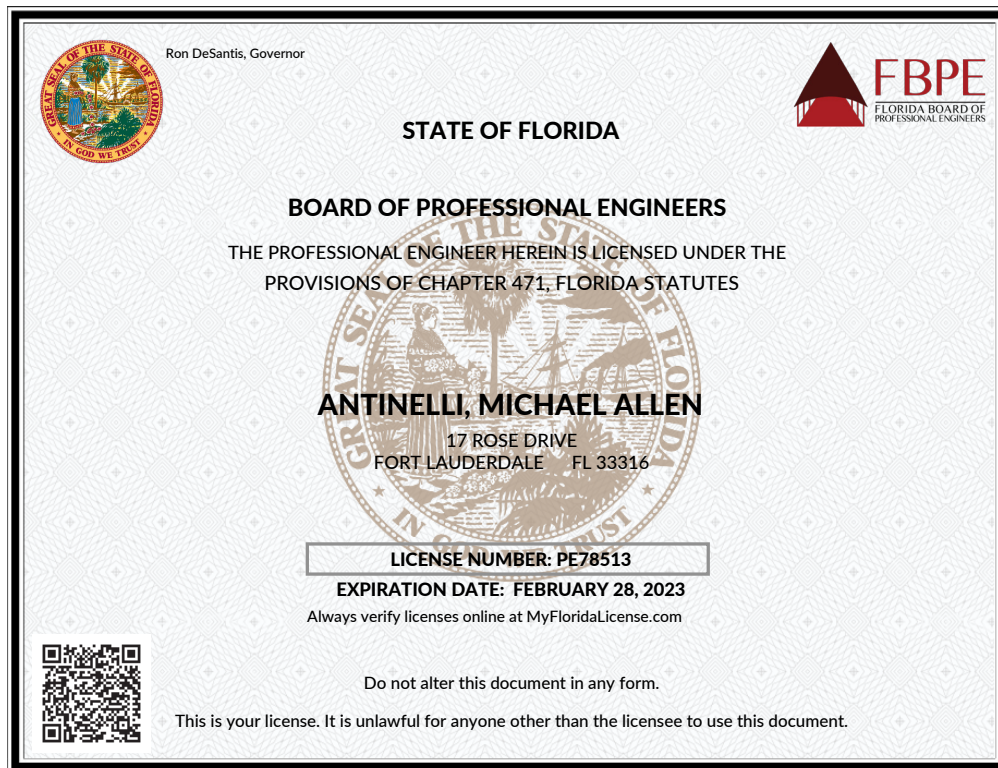

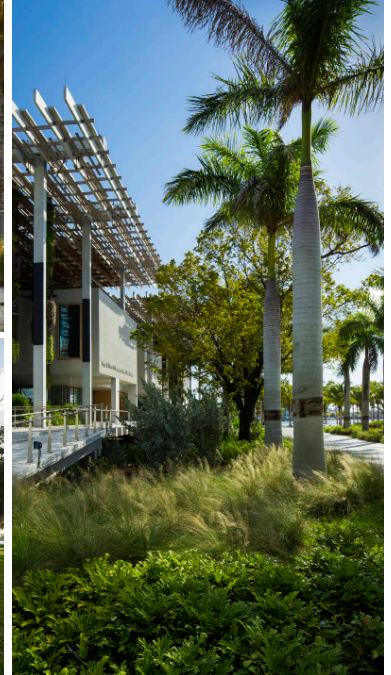

Museum Park is located on the site of the former "Bicentennial Park" that essentially isolated a portion of the Downtown Miami urban fabric from its waterfront. Approximately twenty acres in size, the park sits at the terminus of Government Cut, the City's waterway axis from the Atlantic Ocean. This open space is one of the rare opportunities to publicly access the waterfront in Miami. The park, conceived together with the proposed Perez Art Miami Museum (completed) and the Phillip and Patricia Frost Science Museum (in construction), has become popular for residents and tourists alike, serving the booming urban district adjacent to the park space, and museum visitors. Museum Park Phase I is part of the original Master Plan concept, at a price of \$45 million. In 2010, the recession forced the City to temporarily abandon the project. SMDS understands and believes in the importance of teamwork and effective communication in delivering a successful project. The interdisciplinary background and experience give Savino & Miller a unique insight into the various elements and forces which shape the built environment. The method begins with:

- A. A thorough understanding of community goals as articulated in the design program. Discussion with the client regarding how the space is to be used – or “programmed” – is essential in determining the design responses, such as the ratio between paved and green space, building/shade structures vs. open space, utility/mechanical requirements, park hours, and so on.
- B. An analysis of site factors such as proposed user analysis (i.e. adults, elderly, children, pets), local climate, physical factors including soils, surrounding land use, and socio-cultural context and historical overlay.
- C. Analysis of anticipated facility management models and maintenance resources.

Plantation Village in Crandon Park (former Zoo) (2018 FLASLA Award of Excellence). Our approach for this project included the historic research to develop the project, who's objective was to inspire future generations in the understanding the value of preserving, learning from, and bringing a sense of stewardship to the land.

We completed last year the Miami Baywalk and Riverwalk Unifying Design Elements, Branding and Design Guidelines (2020 FLASLA, AIA & APA Awards) , which its content is in the process of being approved and become part of the Miami 21 Code. The process included many stakeholders and outreach meetings and workshops throughout 5 miles of the waterfront.

- For some of our clients, SMDS has included analysis and site evaluation of existing landscape conditions to make recommendations for improvements and enhancements. As part of the Coconut Grove Planning study with DPZ, Savino & Miller was in charge of evaluating the Playground and Park System for Coconut Grove, making recommendations for future improvements. Our process involved the analysis of existing conditions, neighborhood demographics and growth, and addressing the community to find out their aspirations. The approach was to start with simple “do-able” projects that have an immediate impact in the community while larger improvements for other playgrounds were in the design process.
- SMDS is often a sub-consultant to other professionals, and it is accustomed to respond RFI's, attend public meetings and make presentations to different municipal Staff members as required. In managing RFIs, we have found that organization and timeliness are the keys to success. We make sure one individual is in charge so that no question goes unanswered, and we make sure all questions are answered in a timely manner to expedite the construction process.
- We are well versed in the design and implementation of “Xeriscape” landscapes. Other methods are also available to effectively conserve water and other resources, i.e. the use of slow-emitting/low-trajectory heads, alternative use of ground-plane materials such as gravels and native drought-tolerant plants, and mulching.
- The construction documents and specifications will reflect the most current techniques for low maintenance, resource-efficient, landscapes. Various ways are available to effectively conserve water and other resources, such as grouping plants by water requirements, irrigation “zoning”, the design of porous pipe underground irrigation, use of gravels and native drought-tolerant plants, and mulching. Just as importantly, is the need to minimize demands for maintenance, given the city's existing budget. Where necessary, state of the art irrigation design will be specified for the singular purpose of conserving water incorporating the latest technology in climate and water-sensing technology, such as “Smart Controllers”. We work with Ken Di Donato one of the most experienced consultants in the field.
- In terms of Streetscapes, Savino & Miller Design Studio started its practice with the design of Brickell Avenue Median in Miami. The design of the Median created a sense of place, bringing a powerful character and symbolic importance to the street.
- In other Streetscape designs, decorative paving, site furniture, lighting and planting are designed to create a sense of place, and to encourage public gathering. There are different issues that have been addressed in each one of these solutions, but all of them have contributed in enhancing and creating the City's or neighborhood's identity while creating a safe environment. Most issues to be addressed are visibility, planting location and distances for vehicular safety, character of the street and pedestrian safety. Few examples include:

1. 41st Street Streetscape Improvements: in Miami Beach with its two mosaic-tiled bridges over Biscayne Waterway and Indian Creek;
2. Espanola Way also in Miami Beach and its plaza at Drexel Avenue.

3. 125th Street at the Central Business District, in North Miami.

For Savino & Miller Design Studio each streetscape is unique, inherent to the community where located. Streets are a vital part the City's public open space system. They function as connectors, movement corridors for vehicles for pedestrians, cyclists and support many social and business activities. The appearance and character of the City's streets determine largely the overall quality and livability of the city.

Our design approach focuses on design quality in the public right-of-way, with an emphasis on coherence, beauty, durability, sustainability, accessibility, pedestrian amenity, and tree canopy. SMDS recognizes the different hierarchies of the streets and the inherent challenges in the design approach: collector roads, local roads or alley ways and pedestrian corridors, are all different in character and this is reflected in the Design. The design treatments such as paving, tree canopy lighting and street furniture are extremely important in defining the character and quality of the space.

- Nighttime for Savino & Miller is as important as the daytime. Most of the projects include Lighting Design. Our lighting design provides a sustainable approach with the use of LED lights and lighting controls. The quality of the lighting is extremely important according to the space and the use. A good example of a lighting design project includes the Lighting Design for the historic Pinecrest Gardens (former Parrot Jungle). Most recently SMDS proposed a new standard light for the City of Miami Waterfront as part of the Baywalk Riverwalk Unifying Design Elements and Design Guidelines. About 60 new lights are already installed with the idea of creating a signature identity to the City's waterfront.
- Savino & Miller Design Studio has been involved in some of the largest and most prominent parks recently designed in South Florida. The understanding of the ecology and the socio-cultural values are probably the most important issues to understand when creating a park. These factors help determine the types of activities and programs that will work at a park, and plantings, materials, etc. that can be developed at the site.

The following are a few of our most recent park projects where we were able to bring our knowledge of the ecosystems and regulatory system for this area and our interest and sensibility in the design of Parks:

Maurice Ferre Park (Formerly Museum Park & Bicentennial Park) in the City of Miami is one of our most recent community parks, where we were responsible for of paving, planting and irrigation design. The Planting Palette for this park located on the Bay in Downtown Miami, largely consists of native, coastal hammock species. Our services for Phase I included Schematic Design through Construction Administration Phases for the Baywalk, Entry Promenade and PAMM Plaza, which won a 2015 FLASLA Award of Merit.

South Pointe Park in Miami Beach is a 20-acre park located at the southern tip of Miami Beach. Savino & Miller Design Studio oversaw the Planting & Irrigation and assisted with site planning and the material selection for the entire park. Our Landscape plant palette was based on a native coastal environment. The process included from Schematic Design through Construction Administration. This project included a transplanting plan since a lot of the existing trees were saved and relocated while the construction and preparation of the site took place. Preparation of Permit sets for DERM, and the City of Miami Beach were also part of our services. The Park was completed in 2008 and was the recipient of the 2010 Florida Nursery Growers Association (FNGA) Award of Excellence in Park Design, and the 2019 FLASLA Award of Honor.

Belle Isle Park in Miami Beach is a 4 acre "neighborhood" Park. Located on Belle Isle, part of the Venetian Islands in Miami Beach, it is surrounded by high-rise condominium buildings. It is designed to accommodate different types of uses, from walking and jogging in the path to simple contemplation under large canopy trees to informal playing in the field. It also includes a dog park as requested by the community. The Park is designed with a diverse native planting palette that includes beautiful flowering trees, shrubs, grasses, and palm trees.

Savino & Miller has been involved in several Community at-large park projects. We were the recipients of the American Planning Association, Gold Coast Section Award of Excellence in Landscape Architecture for our Master Plan and Design Guidelines for the Homestead Bayfront Park. This Park located in the waterfront of Miami Dade County, is one of 9 Heritage Parks in the County. The scope area was about 18 Acres. It comprised a master planning of all the facilities existing and proposed activities in the park. Additionally, Savino & Miller re-designed the approach and parking area of the park with the purpose of creating a water retention pond, improving site drainage, reducing asphalt while beautifying the park and improving its image, without reducing the number of parking spaces. By organizing the activities, the design added field areas for passive and active recreation; proposed improvements in the existing pic-nic area, added non-motor water activities such as windsurfing and kayaking, and a new Lighthouse recalling the historic Lighthouse that once was the landmark entrance to the Marina from the bay side.

Savino & Miller is familiar with the community vision session and process to create consensus, presenting design alternatives and eventually preparing documents from Schematic Design through Construction Documents and finally Construction Administration. Currently, we are working on Sunrise Park in the City of Hallandale and 96th Street Park for the Town of Surfside.

- Among Savino & Miller Design Experience in Recreational Facilities, the Surfside Community Center is a project that was master planned to include all outdoor improvements, including a playground, swimming pool which incorporated a plunge pool and slide, Children's Pool and Water Playground, outdoor café, and seating areas, and integrated the beach area to the new pool deck by using the fill created by the building excavation to link the two spaces. The JCC in Miami Beach is another example of a Community Recreational Center, which included a swimming pool, playground, and soccer field.
- Biscayne Park Signage is the most recent Signage design completed. Savino & Miller Design Studio proposed a single material (Corten Steel) laser cut, low maintenance design with solar lighting for a community that prides itself as sustainable and green, and in its designation as a Bird Sanctuary. This design was approved through a community consensus process. In specifying urban furniture, signage, and lighting, we believe that the selection should be based on selecting materials prioritized according to their cradle-to-cradle value, in terms of pre- and post-recycling content and potential.

Simplicity, ease of maintenance, and parts replacement are all important factors for us in the design and selection of signage, site furniture and other site elements.

SMDS also provided the Town of Biscayne Park main signage on NE 6th Avenue.

- Our planting design approach is characterized using a diverse native planting palette that includes beautiful flowering trees, shrubs, grasses, and palm trees as well as native/sub-tropical vegetation. Native groundcover and shrubs will be specified which minimize maintenance, water-consumption (Xeriscape), pesticide and fertilization use. In fact, in some area's plants will be specified to require temporary irrigation only for establishment, and during droughts if necessary.
- Savino & Miller Design Studio provides in all its projects an opinion of Probable Cost based on our experience and keeping up-to date with current practices and different trades.

Savino & Miller Design Studio believes that it has a mission as landscape architect and planner to be a leader in promoting new solutions to urban and environmental problems. This Park (currently under permit) not only will restore an underutilized golf course site by remediating soils contamination, but will also mitigate flooding in the neighborhood while providing recreational opportunities for the community.

The Park entrance promenade and the Baywalk was the focus of this phase in order to connect the two museums (PAMM & FROST) with the City, leaving the central lawn for future improvements, meanwhile we were able to deliver to the Citizens of Miami a Waterfront Park for the new budget.

Savino & Miller has been involved in many projects where both community and business need to be engaged. These projects are Streetscapes, Promenades, Plazas and Parks in the public and private sector.

We are very aware that there are different issues involved in some of these projects where we need to be sensitive to the phasing and the timing so businesses can continue operating without losing revenue. Communication with stakeholders is key in these types of projects where an understanding of realities and expectations can be clarified and coordinated. Communication should be continuous throughout the process.

Some of the Streetscape's projects include 41st. Street, Washington Avenue and Espanola-Drexel in Miami Beach and 125th Street in North Miami. Timing and MOT were some of the most significant issues related to these projects. Other issues that are usually important in these types of projects is the ongoing concern of businesses about the use of trees vs Palms.

In South Point Park, the Smith and Wollensky Restaurant continued operating throughout the design and implementation process of the park.

For the Miami Beach City Hall Complex, where City Offices continued in operation while the project, that included a new park garage, fountain, and plaza, was built. The result was a cohesive open space that ensembled several buildings and provides an amenity for City staff and passerby.

Recently, in the River Landing Project, which is a privately owned building, we were able to create a public promenade along the river that provides not only the new tenants but also the Allapattah community a public amenity promenade on the river.

For the end result selection of materials is key in all these projects: Planting, Paving, Site Furniture and lighting.

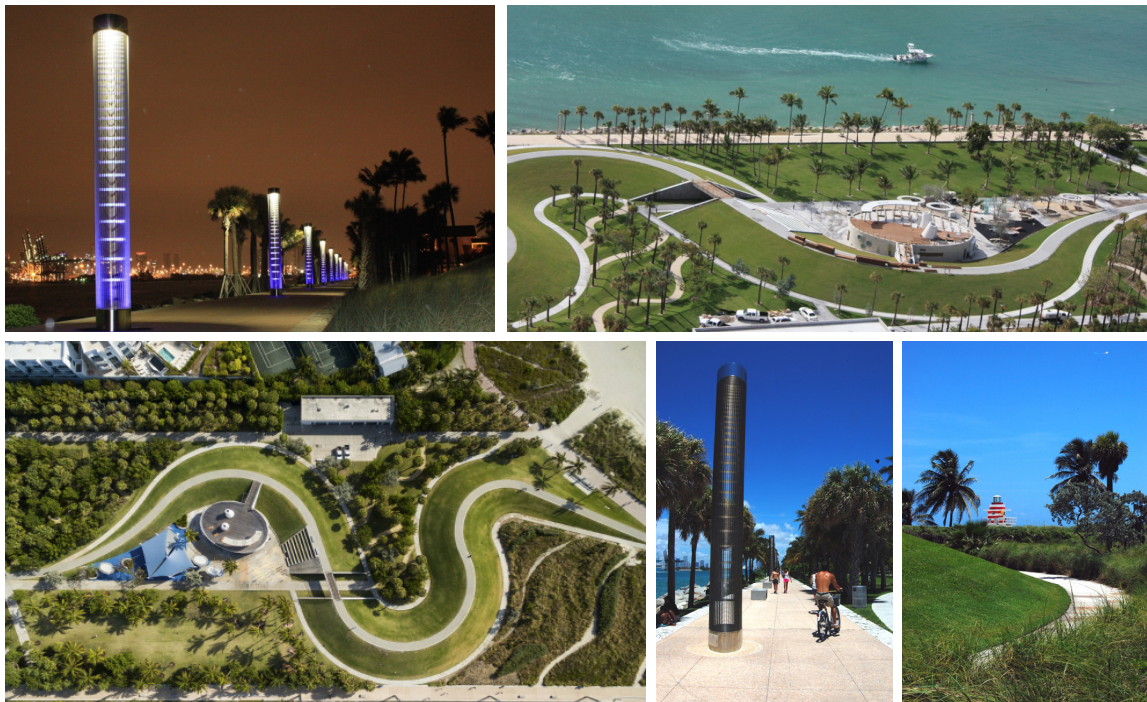

Belle Isle Park, located on the only natural island of the Venetian Islands between Miami and Miami Beach, is a major open space surrounded on three sides by high-density condominium buildings, and Venetian Causeway to the north. The space offered no walkways or large open spaces for play, but was mostly used by residents to walk the dogs. SMDS was asked to create a plan to attract more residents to use the park, and responded with a plan which provided for a range of recreational opportunities. A large elliptical open space formed by a walkway, coupled with a "Bark Park" and numerous small paved seating areas – located by each of the park entry/street crosswalks – allows for both passive and active play activities. Numerous existing trees and palms were preserved or transplanted to create and define the park's spaces.
