(Passed on first reading on September 12, 2019)

On July 1, 2019 the City Manager distributed the City’s Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Annual Operating Budget Estimate in the amount of \$229,041,971 to the City Commission. On July 9, 2019 a workshop was held to present the budget estimate to the City Commission and answer any questions or concerns. The budget that is being presented at the September 20, 2019 (2<sup>nd</sup>) hearing is \$229,939,150; an increase of \$897,179 over the July 1<sup>st</sup> Estimate. The budget that was presented at the September 12, 2019 (1<sup>st</sup>) hearing was \$15,575 higher. Attached to this cover letter is a document that details the \$(15,575) difference between the two budget hearing versions. These changes will be presented at the hearing.
