The State of Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) has awarded the Coral Gables Police Department a Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Program Grant in the amount of \$155,708 to assist with the Department's expenditures related to the prevention, preparation and response to the coronavirus. The Police Department received notification that grant application 2020-CESF-DADE-1-C9-034 was successfully reviewed and approved by FDLE on August 18, 2020.

An amendment to the Fiscal Year 2019-2020 Annual Budget is required to recognize the \$155,708 grant funds as revenue and to appropriate such funds to cover the cost of the grant expenditures.
